



# EXPLORE TERM 3 OUR WONDERFUL WORLD

## MATHS

- Place value within 20 – count on and back from any number, know 1 more and 1 less, compare and order numbers, recognise numbers as words, explore the composition of teen numbers
- Addition – add within 10, use part whole models, recall bonds to 10, explore fact families
- Subtraction – subtract within 10 by taking away and by using a number line
- Shape – name, sort and describe 2D shapes

## ENGLISH

- Recall and recount a story through the use of drama and story maps
- Use descriptive language to describe story settings and characters
- Make predictions about a story
- Write letter from the perspective of a story character
- Create fact files using a non-fiction text

## SCIENCE

- Seasonal changes
- Observe changes across the four seasons
- Observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies

## PE

- Football and rugby – send and receive the ball with accuracy
- Table tennis and cricket – correct hold of a bat and swing with accuracy
- Athletics – running techniques

## GEOGRAPHY

- Name and locate the world's five oceans and seven continents
- Consider geographical similarities and differences between the UK and Africa
- Identify hot and cold areas of the world
- Describe geographical features such as beach, forest, hill, mountain, ocean, river; and human features such as city and town

## PSHE

- Identifying different feelings using the Zones of Regulation
- Discussing different ways to express emotions and developing appropriate coping skills
- Managing strong emotions – how these feel in our bodies and tools to support us

## ENRICHMENT

- Opportunities to either attend offsite trampolining sessions or participate in sporting activities in school
- Using art to express themselves
- Access to after school sports club
- Whole class trip to develop communication and teamwork

## ART/DT

- Use paint and craft resources to create scenes to depict each season
- Create an ocean diorama
- Use collage as a medium to create an African landscape
- Use traditional African patterns
